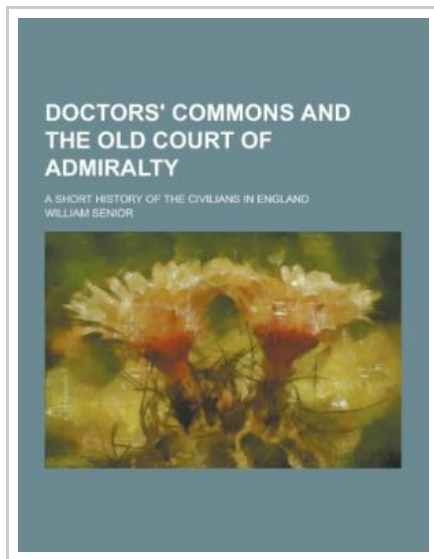




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Excerpt: . V. THE LATTER DAYS OF THE CIVILIANS . James the First brought with him from Scotland a liking for the Civil Law. He said that if it should be taken away it would make an Entry into Barbarism, meaning that there would be no international law left.1 Much might be written on the text of this antithesis, not without very modern illustrations: but in truth James was only emphasising the international aspect of the Roman law in order to allay the fears of those who saw him favouring its professors within the realm. It may be, however, that the civilians in England read into such royal pronouncements a possibility of a new era for them. In 1607 Sir Thomas Ridley dedicated to James his View of the Civil Law, a work designed to show the needlessness of the common lawyer s jealousy. We...



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
